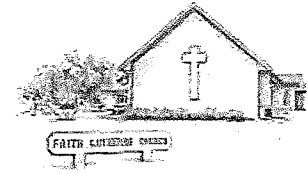

Man and Woman: Created in God's Image

“So God created man in his own image, in the image of God he created him; male and female he created them.” – Genesis 1:27

Dear Friends in Christ Jesus,

Men and women are distinct and complementary creatures. You cannot have one without the other. From a young age children learn that there are differences between women and men. It's a shame that we've fallen so far under the delusion which attempts to denigrate and minimize the differences between the sexes. This is sad because the differences between men and women are God-given, and account for the beauty and order of human society at-large.

Feminism in its modern form seeks to make women and men interchangeable. Ben Shapiro once said: “Feminism was right to point out the fact that men can sometimes be pigs. But where feminism went wrong is when it demanded that women should therefore have the right to be pigs as well.” Do you see the faulty logic? Instead of looking up to shameless sinners, we should seek to imitate the lives of the saints who have gone before us.

Then comes the idea that “you can be whatever you want to be.” This manifests itself with the phenomenon of gender dysphoria that has exploded recently. Women can't be men. And men can't be women. To assert otherwise is to usurp the order of God and reject reality. In the same way, men cannot be mothers, only women have the potential for that blessing from God. Likewise, women aren't called to be pastors because it would be misrepresenting the heavenly Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

Confusion about this came when Adam sat by as his wife listened to Satan. We've been reeling from this ever since. God said to the woman, “Because you have done this, your desire will be for your husband and he shall rule over you.” This desire isn't a loving desire, but a hunger for the authority/responsibility that husbands are to hold in the family. And now what do we see? Men who shirk their responsibilities, and women have to stand in the gap to fulfill the duty that's being left undone. Or on the flip side, a strong-willed woman may undermine and belittle men so she can take the responsibility.

From the beginning, God's intention was that men should provide for and protect their wives and children. This mirrors what Jesus did for us by laying down His life on the cross. Husbands are to love their wives in the same way as Christ does the Church: self-sacrificially, and unconditionally. Wives are called to submit to their husband, who as a Christian will be in submission to God. Husbands are called to love their wives, and the wife is called to respect her husband (Ephesians 5:33).

While men and women are beautifully different, they are both made in God's image. Therefore, both women and men are to be honored because of the dignity of that image they bear. The headship belongs to men, not so much for glory, but for duty and self-sacrificial love and protection of his wife and family. Men are to lead as they are led by Christ. This in turn makes it a blessing to receive that love and care on the part of the woman. For she is trusting in God, who is both her Lord and her husband's Lord.

Next month, we'll consider how children are a blessing and heritage from the Lord.

Ash Wednesday and Lent

Sackcloth and ashes were used throughout Scripture as a sign of repentance. (Think of the people of Nineveh after Jonah preached the message of repentance.) Ashes are a reminder you are a sinner who deserves to die. And yet, the ashes you receive are in the shape of a cross to remind both you of your sin and mortality, but also to remind you of Jesus your Savior who has died your death to give you life.

A note on the season of Lent: “From ancient times the season of Lent has been kept as a time of special devotion, self-denial, and humble repentance born of a faithful heart that dwells confidently on His Word and draws from it life and hope.” (*LSB Altar Book*, 483)

As we prepare our bodies, minds, and souls for the Lenten season, may this be your prayer:

O God, You desire not the death of sinners, but rather that they turn from their wickedness and live. We implore You to have compassion on the frailty of our mortal nature, for we acknowledge that we are dust and to dust we shall return. Mercifully pardon our sins that we may obtain the promises You have laid up for those who are repentant; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen (*LSB Altar Book*, 485)

Next meeting: Keith Huss

Minutes of January 12, 2025: Motion made by Kristy, seconded by Kevin to approve minutes as read. Motion carried.

New Director: Motion made by Karl, seconded by Kevin to appoint Michael Lewis as Director of Public Relations/Parish Fellowship to carry out the term of Kelly Lux who resigned in January (2/9/25 – 12/31/25).

Board of Lay Ministry:

*Orange City is the starting point for Ragbrai this year, so the Board discussed how Faith might take part. They spoke with Pastor Daumer who was here when this took place before. The Board decided to wait until we get more information from the city.

*The Board talked about adding a couple more services: Easter Vigil, April 16 and Accession Day, May 29.

*The Board decided to send Andy to a youth conference (Higher Things) at Concordia University in Seward, NE July 8-11, 2025. He will go with a group from St. John's Lutheran Church, Germantown.

*Time & Talent Surveys were reviewed by the Board; a few more have come in since the December deadline.

*Michael shared a possible tool, such as using a QR code, for people to complete the surveys. Paula will provide him with copies of the forms turned in and a list of members who haven't turned in a form.

Board of Education: (The Board met on January 29.)

*There will be Teacher Recognition on May 11, following the Divine Service. Paula has been asked to make cake to serve during Fellowship Time / eggs will be provided.

*VBS will take place July 13 – 17 (same time frame or it may be shifted to a different time depending on the age of students who sign up).

*VBS will use the curriculum from last year (Celebrate the Savior) since last year's VBS was cancelled. Mike has downloaded materials to the church computer.

*In Sunday School last week, the children made valentines and gave them to pastor to hand out to home bound or nursing home members.

Board of Evangelism:

*Talked about Ragbrai and how to address this. More to come at the next Council meeting.

*It was mentioned that the Board of Evangelism has more dealings with the Board of PR/PF than any of the other Boards. Tonya said she also goes to Paula for information and for getting the word out.

Board of Properties:

*Nothing new to report.

Board of Public Relations & Parish Fellowship:

*Michael met with Pastor and Mike regarding the position. Together they came up with a lot of ideas to become more communitive regarding the events going on at Faith.

*With Michael's business, he shared some tools that could be used to send out text messages automatically to families, a community board posting youth events/activities, service groups, our church calendar, and other ideas for the website to keep people informed of events.

*Motion made by Jesa, seconded by Kristy to have Michael review our website and see if we could switch to a different platform that he has, and which would be less expensive. Motion carried.

Board of Stewardship:

*Kevin reported that we surpassed the Building Fund Match of \$5,000 in the first week of February (\$5,470.00) and have the rest of February to go. This match is for the Building Fund loan.

*It was noted that we have \$20,000 in the restricted fund, if needed for a new furnace.

*General Fund in January was \$5,000 behind budget (not including the loan).

*Discussed showing weekly and monthly finance figures in the bulletin. It was asked how hard do we push the money issue? Tabled this discussion until next month, giving Kevin and Paula time to meet.

Board of Youth:

*Ali reported that the Easter Breakfast this year is going to be a potluck at 8:00am with a free-will donation. Sign up sheet will be used.

*It was mentioned that 'sign-up sheets' might be another tool that could be handled electronically, along with posting pictures of youth group events, etc.

Treasurer:

*Kristy mentioned that expenses in January were \$5,000 over budget, due to some large expenditures (i.e. Ramsey Solutions, software annual renewal, and Sunday School materials).

Committee Reports: None.

Correspondence:

*Mike shared an email received from 'Reference Audio, Video and Security' who support churches with their audio, video, and security systems. No action taken.

*Mike read some 'thank you' notes from individuals who received a monetary Christmas gift.

State of the Parish: Pastor Batchelder

*Pastor shared that he is currently reading a book and thought others might be interested. It's called 'The Small Town Lutheran Church & Pastor' by Rev Heath Curtis and gives guidance for how we as God's people are to approach any of our challenges.

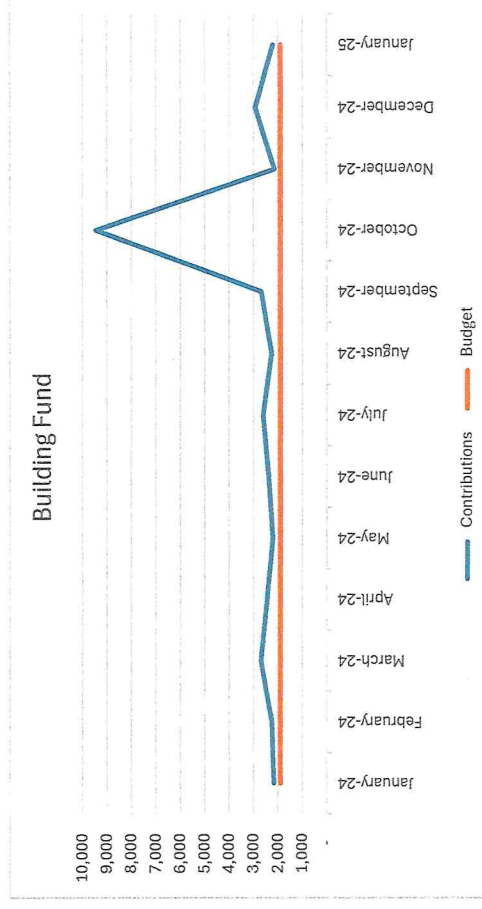
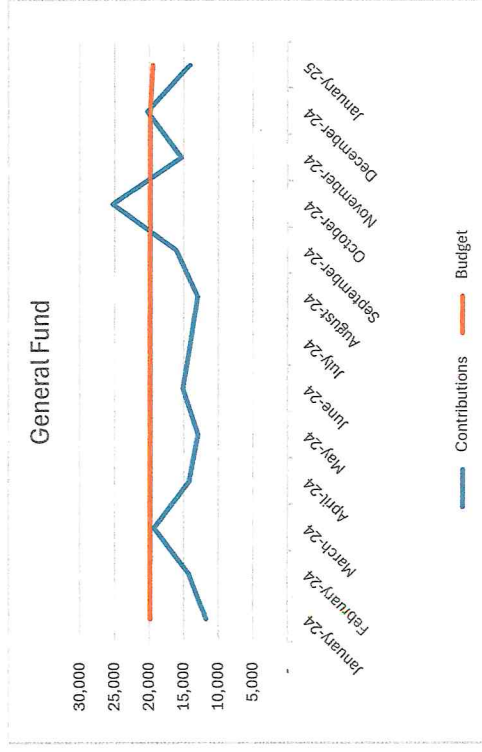
