

2024 Pastor's Annual Report

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ Jesus,

"Seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be added to you." Matthew 6:33

This past year proved to be full of God's blessings. The Lord's presence in His Word and Sacraments has kept us, and will continue to keep us, on the path that leads to life. God gives Himself to us that we might be sanctified and freed from our sin and from the power of the devil. All of this is on account of our Lord Jesus Christ, who took upon our human flesh, suffered and died in our place, and is risen again.

One thing I still wrestle with is the notion of apathy that's been mentioned previously. I'm not sure if what I see is apathy. I wonder if maybe some people are spread too thin with the various activities that fill the calendar. Perhaps others want to serve in the congregation, but they don't know where to start. I want us to work together to think of ways we can rally together as a congregation to build up the body of Christ here and to serve our community.

Everyone in our congregation has a story of how God's grace in Christ has impacted them. We all are going through various unknown trials. The same is true for those around us in Orange City and the neighboring cities. How might we shine the light of Christ to one another here, and to others out there? How might we be able to "bear one another's burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ" (Galatians 6:2)?

What I'm trying to get at is for us as a congregation to reflect on who we are and what we're about. I would answer by saying: we are redeemed children of God in Christ Jesus, gathered together at Faith Lutheran Church to grow in God's Word and to bring that same Word to others.

With all the struggles you may face as individuals, or as families, or we share together as a congregation, we must take Jesus' words to heart: "Seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be added to you." There are four real issues we are faced with: concerns about declining and older membership; finances; volunteers; and inactive members. I've worried about these things, and I'm sure you have as well. But the solution to all of these issues are found in God's Word.

My prayer is that in 2025 we can together take pride and ownership in who we are as Faith Lutheran Church. We offer many opportunities for worship, fellowship, Bible study, and ways to serve. The foundation is there, and so the possibilities are endless for how we can serve the Lord together.

No matter what happens, Jesus promises that if we entrust ourselves and all things to Him, He will in fact take care of the heavy lifting. For He calls us to take up His yoke and His burden, which to us is light, because He has overcome sin, death, and the power of the devil. And nothing can separate you from the love of God in Christ Jesus, our Lord.

2024 Youth Year End Report

In 2024, we continued our engagement with the youth, fostering their growth in faith. The youth met on Sunday evenings to discuss a text from the LCMS Lectionary series. Our 7th – 12th grades typically convened on the first and third Sundays of the month, averaging approximately ten attendees. Following devotions, we would have a snack and engage in games. Additionally, we maintained our open game nights that included activities such as bean bags, board games, and ping pong.

To further nurture their faith, we incorporated Bible Jeopardy, offering various topics for the youth to explore. We also upheld the tradition of nailing sins to the cross, a practice intended to be meaningful not only for the youth but for everyone entering the sanctuary, serving as a poignant reminder of Jesus' sacrifice. In the fall of 2024, we initiated a Bible study titled "Catechism 2.0: The Lord's Supper," examining scriptural references in Matthew, Mark, Luke, and 1 Corinthians concerning the New Testament perspective on the Lord's Supper. I extend my gratitude to Pastor Batchelder for his participation in our youth events, which significantly aids in relationship building.

Our JLYF group, consisting of 4th – 6th graders, serves as an introduction to the youth group. They enjoyed a bowling outing in April, followed by dessert at Wells Blue Bunny. In the fall of 2024, we commenced with a devotion focusing on themes such as "Are you great?", "Are you worthy?", concluding the year with "Gratitude". In November, after the devotion on gratitude, the youth wrote thank you cards to individuals they appreciated, including parents, teachers, coaches, and others.

I would like to express my sincere thanks to Ali Hagen (Chairperson, Director of Young People's Work), Pastor, and all the parents who assisted with transportation and support over the years. My gratitude extends to all members of Faith Lutheran for your unwavering support throughout the past seven years. I could not have accomplished this without your dedication and God's guidance.

2024 Board of Evangelism Annual Report

Evangelism is defined as the spreading of the Christian gospel by public preaching or personal witness. The purpose is to put all men, women, and children in touch with God, to learn about our Savior, Jesus Christ, and to help reach those who may be lost. It continues to be very important that we all do our part to extend our hearts and hands to others in order to educate, remind, and share God's words. Listed below you will find ways in which the Evangelism Committee and Faith Lutheran Church extended our hearts and hands.

Outreach to local college students at Northwestern and Dordt University – Faith hosted a table at both college events in the fall in order to welcome students to the community, hand out information, and invite them to attend Faith Lutheran Church in Orange City.

Heart and Soles - Faith Lutheran Church members donated shoes and socks in order to help offset the cost of back-to-school supplies and other needs for families.

Samaritan's Purse Operation Christmas Child (shoeboxes) - Our congregation filled around 25 shoeboxes this year!

During the month of September, a 'Door Offering' was collected and sent to Trinity Lutheran Church in Hawarden for their flood relief. Also, the children took an offering at their Christmas Program on December 15, and the proceeds were sent to Trinity Lutheran.

Harvest Meal - The Annual Harvest Meal and Youth Bake Sale were held on November 24 with proceeds from the meal going to Lutheran Early Response Teams (L.E.R.T.).

Christmas Caroling to area nursing facilities was held on December 22, 2024.

Main Street Living – Faith supports this 'Lutheran Television Program' which provides a worship experience for people who cannot attend services on a regular basis. It broadcasts each Sunday on KDLT-NBC, Sioux Falls and KCAU-ABC, Sioux City (at 10:00am Central time). The first portion of the program includes an episode of 'This is the Life', followed by a worship service led by area LCMS clergy.

Mission Central – Through our mission giving's this year, Faith supported Shara and Michael Osiro, missionaries to Eastern and Southern Africa.

The following organizations were supported financially through our 2024 Missions Budget: LCMS Hispanic Ministry, Lutheran Family Service, Lutheran Bible Translators, Sioux City Gospel Mission, Zestos, Lutheran Hour Ministries, Mission Central, and Main Street Living.

The following organizations were supported through our Special Service Offerings: Genesis House, Lutherans for Life, ATLAS/Center for Financial Education, Family Crisis Center, Camp Okoboji, POBLO, Orange City Food Pantry, Habitat for Humanity, Lutheran World Relief, Mid-Sioux Opportunity, and our Congregational Assistance Fund.

Church services were offered via livestream on our website at www.faithlutheranorange city.com and our Facebook page at 'Orange City Faith Lutheran Church' - a way for members and all others to stay connected and to learn about Faith Lutheran Church activities, and services.

Mike remained the Youth Director through the first of December and Andrew (Andy) Reginald will be taking over starting the New Year in 2025. We are thankful for Mike's faithful seven years of service to our youth, knowing that over these years, he had an impact on all of our youth!

YouthLead (grades 7-12) met twice a month and our JLYF (grades 4-6) met once a month for devotions and fellowship activities. Along with their devotions and games at church, they helped prepare for our first ever Easter Egg Hunt; helped prepare egg bakes and served the Easter breakfast; were greeters on Sunday mornings on two different occasions; and helped prepare baked items for the Harvest Meal bake sale. Our average attendance for YouthLead was between 8-10 youth.

Our younger youth had some fun activities, events, and opportunities as well! They helped fill the Easter eggs for the egg hunt; went bowling (in which they learned Pastor was a great bowler!); had ice cream at Blue Bunny; and this fall they painted pumpkins. Our average attendance for JLYF was about 5 youth.

We are grateful to the families that continue to help to support these two groups to continue to grow and to be an important part of our youth's foundation. Again, we are thankful to Mike Blankenfeld for serving our youth these past seven years and look forward to how Andy can continue to help our youth grow, as we know he has a heart and passion for Jesus and the Word.
