Children: A Blessing and Heritage From the Lord

"And God blessed them. And God said to them, 'Be fruitful and multiply and fill the earth and subdue it...'" – Genesis 1:28

Dear Friends in Christ Jesus,

God has established that the family, that is, the relationship between a husband and wife is the foundation and cornerstone for all of society. In the intimacy of marriage, God has given this blessing: 'Be fruitful and multiply.' God brings about each new generation through the joining together of the wife and her husband.

What does God say about children? "Behold, children are a heritage from the LORD, the fruit of the womb a reward. Like arrows in the hand of a warrior are the children of one's youth. Blessed is the man who fills his quiver with them" (Psalm 127:3-5). Children are a heritage and a reward, a blessing which God Himself gives.

While a husband and wife participate in the means of procreation, the fruitfulness of the womb is only something God can give. Sexual intimacy as designed by God is a joyful expression of the love that a wife and husband have towards each other. The end goal of sex, however, is not pleasure but is procreation. To pursue only pleasure twists God's gift of intimacy into selfishness.

I've heard some thoughts from well-meaning Christians that I want to share and perhaps add some clarity from God's Word. Thoughts like: "We think God wants us to start having kids later in our marriage." "X many children is the ideal amount for us; no more and no less." "We can only afford X amount of kids."

What do these thoughts have in common? They put our reason and pride above what God has designed. If a couple is married and engages in physical intimacy, then they are ready to receive the fruit of that union. To put an ideal number to how many kids to have is just arbitrary. What happens if God gives you more or less children than you had hoped for? While children certainly require much time, effort, and resources, how can we put a price tag on human souls that are invaluable? A seminary professor once said: "God talks about both money and children. But he only warns against the pursuit of money. God only and ever describes children as a blessing from His hand."

How can we as the Church embrace family life and children? For younger married couples, be open to receiving the gift of children. Children require a lot of love and care, but they are blessings. For couples no longer in the biological window for child-rearing: encourage younger families, share wisdom and insights from your years of parenting. For couples who are unable to conceive children: remember that though God may withhold the gift of children, you are still His children. The Lord has not forsaken you.

May God lead us to embrace the gift of family and children. May the Lord save us from ever looking down upon His little ones. And may we strive to teach the faith so that our children would fear, love, and trust in God above all things.

Youth Update

"This month, I was thrilled to teach YouthLead and JLYF about the nature of saving faith.

On March 9, the YouthLead read through the entirety of Romans chapter four, which describes what it really means to have faith in God. In this passage of Scripture, the Apostle Paul uses Abraham as the example for Christians in the New Covenant. God promised to Abraham that he'd have a son, and he believed in God, and so the Lord declared that Abraham as righteous. Similarly, if we believe in the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, we are declared to be righteous before God. Therefore, saving faith is defined as trusting in God's promises. Afterwards, the YouthLead had a snack, and the night was finished with games of Ping Pong, Infection Tag, and Sardines.

On March 16, JLYF read part of Romans chapter four, where the Apostle Paul uses Abraham as an example of justification by faith (read the description above for further details about the message). After this, the students enjoyed snacks, and we all played a fun game of cornhole.

On March 23, the YouthLead read the entirety of Romans chapter five, which talks about what we, as Christians, gain through faith in Christ. Through being justified by faith, we are reconciled with God and rejoice in our sufferings for His sake. Our suffering produces endurance, endurance produces character, and character produces hope. Furthermore, even though we were sinners, God was so loving that He sent His Son, Jesus, to die for us, even though we didn't deserve it. Also in that chapter, Paul details a beautiful parallel between Adam and Christ. Adam sinned against God by eating from the Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil, and because of that, all his descendants are born in sin, and are therefore condemned. However, through the death of Christ on the Cross, all who believe in Him are gifted with His perfect righteousness and are therefore justified. Afterwards, all the students enjoyed snacks and played a Bible trivia game.

Overall, the Youth of Faith Lutheran Church learned a lot about God's salvation revealed in Jesus Christ and grew in fellowship with the Lord and with one another.

Meeting began with opening devotions by Tonya Moore-Huss

Next meeting: Karl Bahrke Minutes of February 9, 2025: Motion made by Kristy, seconded by Karl to approve minutes with one correction under Board of Youth - that no free-will donations will be taken at the Easter potluck. Motion

carried.

Board of Lay Ministry:

*The Board has divided the names on Dave Foreman's lay ministry list among the remaining six elders.

*Nothing has yet been decided on the use of the church facilities for the Ragbrai people.

Board of Christian Education:

*The date for VBS has been changed from July 13-17 to July 20-24 (time frame 6-8pm).

Board of Evangelism:

- *Nothing yet put in place regarding participation in Ragbrai.
- *Faith is asked to provide volunteers on Saturday, April 26, to serve at the Food Pantry (8:30 Noon). (Note Paula called the Food Pantry and verified this time frame.) Mike B. helped in the past and explained the process of what volunteers help with. Tonya will prepare an announcement to be sent out requesting volunteers. Spanish speaking volunteers are also asked to help.
- *There is also a list of basic food and hygiene items needed so maybe Faith could have a 'food drive' with a box put out to collect these items for the Food Pantry.
- *It was asked if there's a protocol on how to support members who experience different life experiences (i.e. deaths, celebrations, birthdays)? It was mentioned that in the past Bev Rohrs contacted people to help with providing meals, etc.

Board of Properties:

*Mike reported that March is the time of year when our insurance is renewed, and it has increased. Kurt List (Hospers) has replaced Brenda Richardson as our agent. He dropped off a folder with our new policies and increases in premiums. Our March invoice shows a monthly amount due of \$1,089.10 (an increase of \$322.28 per month). He is available if the council wants to meet with him and says there are not a lot of agencies that are insuring churches. Kristy will check with him if there's any discount if paid once a year or every 6 months vs. monthly.

Board of Public Relations & Parish Fellowship:

- *The website has been transferred over to Michael's business, so not having to pay the monthly \$25 fee to Lifepoint Digital. Michael asked Jesa to be his backup, helping with the website.
- *He talked about developing a form for VBS registration and later for promoting VBS.
- *He asked about posting an invitation he received regarding a 'ladies day out' conference on 'self-love' on March 15 at the community center in Sutherland (cost \$35). It was decided not to promote this.
- *He shared several things he's working on: like putting a slide show together that could be put on the screen on Sundays or on Facebook; creating a calendar built off the current church calendar; posting a Bible verse every Monday (Mike B. mentioned Concordia Publishing House is a good resource for this.); creating a form to get feedback from members, if wanted. If there are any other ideas, let him know.
- *He also said that he won't be connecting to the Shepherd Staff program because of the issues with recording the contributions, etc.

Board of Stewardship:

- *February's building fund offerings were just short of \$19,000. By continuing our \$1900 monthly payment, the loan could be paid off by next March 2026 (at 7 years of the 20 year loan).
- *The general fund offerings were above budget also.
- *Financial Peace University class finishes today, March 9.
- *It was decided to just post the 'monthly' financial totals in the bulletin each week, rather than the 'weekly' totals.

Board of Youth:

- *It was reported that the youth meetings have been going well with Andy Reginald. There has been 8-10 attending YouthLead and 3-5 attending JLYF.
- *It was noted that Andy is not on social media, so need to correspond by email.

Treasurer:

- *Kristy said February was a good month for both general fund and the building fund loan; looking like the loan will be paid off next year.
- *It was mentioned that when the loan is paid off, we will keep going with our building fund.

Committee Reports: None.

Correspondence: None.

State of the Parish: Pastor Batchelder

- *Will plan to do the Guiding Star baby bottle fundraiser in April (instead of March).
- *Pastor reported on the Incident Impact Roundtable meeting at the Orange City Fire Department, saying it was informative and got us thinking about a lot of different things: what to do if there's a fire or tornado; how do we take care of our members and neighbors, and being alert to all the things that we need to be prepared for.

Unfinished Business:

*Howard Vlieger emailed the constitution to the council with revisions regarding combining of the Board of Christian Education and Board of Young People's work, asking for feedback. He re-sent it a second time after input from a couple of people, but needs all members to reply with their approval or changes so this can be sent on to the District and to our members.

New Business:

*Addressed more issues/questions about Ragbrai: not comfortable opening up the church because needs to be staffed at all times; the issue of insurance; allowing people to use the church grounds; participating downtown with the food vendors but have to pay a price and give a portion of the proceeds back to the city; may have to change church service time; what have other Lutheran churches done when Ragbrai has been in their town. The Board of Lay Ministry passed this on for the council to make these decisions. Tabled until the next council meeting.

Adjournment: Motion made by Tonya, seconded by Kevin to adjourn. Motion carried.

He closed by asking for any comments or questions and offered to visit with anyone who has concerns; stating, the solution to any concern can be found in God's Word.


