The Fall of Creation

"Then the LORD God said... 'What is this that you have done?'" - Genesis 3:13

Dear Friends in Christ Jesus,

When God saw all that He had made, it was all very good. The care and attention to detail that God worked into creation is wonderful and awe-inspiring. But this goodness did not last long. For the devil slithered into Eden and began sowing his seeds of doubt.

"Did God really say???" says the serpent. What better way is there to cause doubt and division than by making someone question "the Lord and themselves". "Did God really say not to eat of the fruit of the tree? For God knows that you will be like God, knowing good and evil." Eve heard this, saw that the fruit was good for food, and believed the devil rather than the Lord. Worst of all, Adam stood by idly watching his wife be the first guinea pig in Satan's lies and snares. When nothing had apparently happened, he took the fruit and ate as well.

The created order was subverted in this moment. Mankind wanted to be like God, but on the basis of pride and not on the basis of obedience. When confronted about his sin Adam pointed the finger at Eve and at God. The woman, learning from her husband, passed blame away from herself and pointed to the serpent.

For this rebellion God put this curse upon us and creation: for womankind, hardship and pain in childbearing, as well as the desire to take the headship of her husband; for man, "cursed is the ground because of you; only in pain you shall eat of it all the days of your life; thorns and thistles it shall bring forth for you." Things had previously been good. But now things were anything but good: division, conflict, sin, evil, and the like all are fruits of the fall into sin. We all know and feel these evils all too well.

God the Lord is a jealous God, and wasn't content to watch His children and creation remain in a state of sin and evil. And so He made a pledge to us: "I will put enmity between you [the devil] and the woman, and between your [Satan's] offspring and her offspring; he shall bruise your head, and you shall bruise his heel."

To redeem and restore creation back to its original goodness, God promised to send a savior who would be born of woman. This is God pledging to send His only-begotten Son. "When the fulness of time had come, God sent forth his Son, born of woman, born under the law, to redeem those who were under the law, so that we might receive adoption as sons" (Galatians 4:4-5).

Next month, we will look more in depth at Christ who is our redeemer, and the One who ushers in the New Creation.

Look carefully then how you walk, not as unwise but as wise, making the best use of the time, because the days are evil. — Ephesians 5:15-16

Dear Friends in Christ Jesus,

Consider a typical day in your week. Think about all the things you have to do, the things you want to do, and the things you ought to do. How much time do you devote to these various things? Just consider how much time you devote to work, leisure, entertainment, sports, family, the gym, etc.

Now ask yourself: how much time do you regularly set aside to read Holy Scripture? To pray? My encouragement with this blurb is for all of us to take stock of how we spend our time. If we're not devoting ourselves to the study of God's Word and prayer, it's a good time to start building up these holy habits.

If you're looking for a place to start with studying the Bible, I'd suggest you start with either Genesis, John, or Ecclesiastes. And if you are looking for a resource on prayer, find your Small Catechism or borrow/buy a hymnal for your family, and start by praying Luther's morning and evening prayers at the beginning and end of the day. Then feel free to add in the Apostles' Creed as well as the Lord's prayer. And even if you have to pray these by reading them out loud, you have found a brief, yet useful, devotional pattern.

May God lead us all to have a hunger for His Word. Amen.

Faith Lutheran Church Council Minutes – April 13, 2025

In attendance: Mike Blankenfeld, Chairman; Karl Bahrke, Director of Lay Ministry; Kristy Frederes, Treasurer; Michael Lewis, Director of PR/PF; Ali Hagen, Director of Young People's Work; Kevin Rueter, Director of Stewardship; Jesa Pace, Director of Christian Education; Jason Overmohle, Director of Church Properties; Pastor Batchelder, and Paula Koller, Council Secretary.

Meeting began with opening devotions by Karl

Next meeting: Jesa Pace

Minutes of March 9, 2025: Motion made by Kristy, seconded by Karl to approve the minutes as read. Motion carried.

Board of Lay Ministry:

- *Karl announced that Jordon Pace has been appointed as a new Lay Minister (replacing Howard Vlieger).
- *Service times for Holy Week are set as follows: Maundy Thursday -7:00pm; Good Friday -7:00pm; and Easter Vigil -8:00pm. Easter potluck will be at 8:00am and the Easter Service at 9:00am.
- *It was mentioned that maybe next year we could discuss changing confirmation classes to 6:00pm, and have Midweek Lenten Services start at 7:00pm.
- *The Board discussed the survey that is being put together by Michael Lewis.

Board of Christian Education:

- *There will be teacher recognition on Sunday, May 11; and this will be the last day of Sunday School for the school year.
- *Will start promoting VBS after Easter (July 20-24 from 6:00-7:30pm) (4 year olds through 5th grade). Michael L. is getting a registration sheet ready for on-line. Mentioned also having a sign-up sheet on the table. (Paula will send Jesa a copy of a 'registration sheet' seeing what was used in the past.) Will wait to see how many register before asking for volunteers.

Board of Evangelism:

- *Mike B. reported that one more volunteer is needed for the OC Food Pantry distribution on April 26 (8:30am-noon).
- *For Ragbrai (Saturday, July 19) it was reported that only the parking lot will be available for people to use. So no one is needed to monitor the 'inside' but will need a cleanup crew to help afterward, before church on Sunday, July 20. It was mentioned that maybe could combine a 'Ragbrai cleanup crew' with a 'VBS setup crew' on the 20th?

Board of Properties:

- *Cooper Katt has been lined up for mowing, and the mower has been serviced.
- *Jason will take care of installing a handrail in the women's bathroom (new addition).
- *It was mentioned that at some point, we need to build up the \$20,000 on reserve in the Restricted Fund to meet our deductible (if needed) or for replacing one or two of the furnaces. It was mentioned that a new furnace runs in the \$20,000 range.

Board of Public Relations & Parish Fellowship:

- *Michael is building up the website and putting together a slide show, not yet sure of the logistics on how to get people's information out there. Some things mentioned were senior graduations or recognizing other milestones, a VBS promo, including pictures, etc. It was mentioned having a flat screen TV in the fellowship hall, displaying information.
- *A 'survey' for getting feedback from members is being developed. Michael is open to suggestions of what questions to ask. It was noted that the Board of Lay Ministry wants to see the survey before it gets put out there, and so does the Council. So when ready, Michael will forward a draft to Paula who will get it sent to the Lay Ministers and the Council.
- *A form for on-line VBS registrations and for promoting VBS is being created.

Board of Stewardship:

*Kevin said there was not much to report. The March General Fund offerings were \$17,392, up 18% from last year.

Board of Youth:

*It was reported on July 27 (6:30pm) there will be a 'wrap-up' meeting for all youth $(4^{th} - 12^{th})$ grades) and their parents. Andy is planning this event and will be seeking suggestions for next year. Currently there are 6 on the roster for JLYF, with an average of 1-3 coming to the meetings; and, there are 24 on the roster for YouthLead with an average of 10 attending. YouthLead students are attending church regularly which is a plus.

*Not a lot of people have signed up for the Easter Breakfast Potluck. So will have to see how it goes and plan accordingly for next year. (An idea for the future included pancakes. In the past borrowed the grille from the fire fighters.)

Treasurer:

*Kristy said not a lot to report; no big expenses; income for the month was good; just short of \$2,000 from our budgeted amount.

Committee Reports: None.

Correspondence:

*Mike B. read a letter from the MOC-Floyd Valley After Prom Committee requesting a monetary gift for the After Prom party scheduled for April 26. One suggestion was made to give \$50 from the Restricted Fund Thrivent account. Motion made by Karl, seconded by Kevin to check to see what we have given in the past, and give the same amount this year. Motion carried.

State of the Parish: Pastor Batchelder

Jesus said, "And I tell you, you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it." – Matthew 16:18

- The Church is an article of faith: "I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Holy Christian Church, the communion of saints..."
